SERMA - SUPER

Guntersville, Alabama May 19 & 20, 2007

What a SUPER weekend it was for SPA pilots who "burned-holes-in-the-sky" over SERMA here. All of the 27 flyers, friends and family now know and understand the true story behind the name SERMA (Suckegg Road Model Airfield) for it was delivered as a sort of history lesson....just prior to the Pledge of Allegiance, Invocation and our National Anthem by Lee Ann Rimes. This was "prelim" to the Pilots briefing Saturday morning.

Some pilots arrived on Thursday, most all on Friday where some 35 folks consumed the better part of 4 tasty smoked Boston Butts with all the trimmings provided by Bill Collins, Sr. and Jr. of Collins' Auto Parts. RV's, Tents and other camping-like vehicles lined the allocated region from about mid-day Friday til conclusion. Saturday morning, the winds of Friday diminished to a steady 5 to 10 from the North and right down the runway, described by many as "just the right speed". We never failed to thank the Chief for the good shower on Wednesday and the comfy low humidity throughout the entire weekend. As advertised, flying started promptly at 9:30 AM and 4 rounds pushed a 6 PM departure for the Outlaw Steakhouse and a Saturday night banquet, fellowship and a good program. 42 attended the Saturday night gathering which saw special awards to locals Bob Wilkes and Wendell Cornelius for their excellent prep of the field. Steve Vergamini of Greensboro, NC received a special award

for "furtherest travel". A special upright desk stand of walnut and GOLD, with a genuine Scribes' pen was given CD Steve Byrum for his tireless duties performed. A beautiful evening indeed. Sunday, as advertised, flying started promptly at 9:30 AM. two terrific rounds with conclusion about 1:15 PM with a combo "judged and announced" performance by Mr. Ed Hartley for the spectators and family friends. Hosts Cass Underwood and Bill Collins presented 27 plaques.....YES, every pilot received a permanent memento for his constant reminder of the fun and fellowship at the 1st SERMA SPA Invitational. (ALL RC flyers were invited). A pewter replica of a Bar-B-Q cooker went to Bill Collins for his excellent food preparation. The word of the weekend was"THANKFULNESS"....from the SERMA group of 5 + Steve to the participants which was the identical number at the "best attended contest of the 2006 season". 2007's contest season is "off and running" now with one of the finest contests I have ever had the honor of co-CDing. Not one, no not one single negative was voiced, what a delightful way to kick-off a contest season. Cass U., the Host and initiator of the event, shared the gratuities as he presented the trophies and MC'd the concluding session. (Remember that DR beauty in the last newsletter owned by Mr. John Baxter.....?!) It was chosen "most beautiful bird" by pilots at SERMA and earned John a nice award.


If anyone was "deserving" of a golden Scribes' desk-stand, it is Steve.

SEC/TRES STEVE BYRUM says: Look at our progress on the CULLMAN field !

We have all come to know and love the Cullman ramp. This is the easiest 10 take off in pattern. Just drive straight and apply throttle. The ramp will put you in the air at a perfect angle, and the judges are SO impressed with your skill.



Well, you can all forget that. Cullman Aeromodelers have spent most of \$10,000 this Spring, finally making much needed repairs to our primary flying site. At 7:00 AM on April 21, instead of making final preparations for the SPA season opener, this was going on in Cullman. Several work days were held, and a LOT of rocks were removed. More dirt was added over Memorial Day weekend, and a contractor again graded the field. We are most fortunate that we have a diverse membership. One of our members works for a company which builds industrial sites and highways. As things worked out, they are working on a site about five miles from our field. Our member arranged for a grader and operator to spend some time on our runway when it was not needed at the site. The result :



We bought 90 rolls of sod 100 feet long. We were able to surface a runway 60 x 460, a pit area and pilots' boxes 40×110 and a spectator area 40×50 in front of our sunshade. We have also graded and expanded our parking lot. The unsodded areas have been seeded in preparation for today's rain which actually happened. We now have:



By the next day....we had:



Looks like a farmer would prepare his future field for planting of his prized crop, doesn't it....but.....read on:



Lots of rolling and mowing remain to be done. We expect to begin flying off the new runway about July 1st. Our first planned event will be an SPA Trick or Treat to be held Oct 27 and 28. More details will follow. STEVE

(Editor Note)....This project has been "a long-time coming". But is a terrific "step in the right direction" for the Cullman Aeromodelers. That event Steve refers to above, is, IMHO going to be more of a TREAT...and that's no trick!

Steve and the group were simply "heartbroken" when the field had not been prepared for the season opening SPA contest event this season....but, based on the photos and the text in this story, it's going to be well worth the wait to fly off this renovated and improved field in Cullman.
